- Two courses in the same period in the same semester
- Failure of or lacking a prerequisite course
- Master Schedule changes for population growth or master schedule conflicts
- Dual Enrollment (once approved)
- Senior needing a graduation requirement
- To balance classes so that overcrowding does not occur

Students choose their courses and will remain in their selections; schedule changes for teacher style or preference are not appropriate. All conflicts are to be resolved in a mature, professional manner. We ask that the student and parent first take the responsibility to meet with the teacher and work through the problem (or counselor if an error is suspected to have been made during programming). If a solution cannot be reached, the parent or teacher should contact an administrator to meet about the issue.
